LAMP OBJECTIVE

The Learning and Migration Program (LAMP) started in 2017-18 in Chhattisgarh and stands as a comprehensive initiative by Samerth Charitable Trust, with the invaluable support of the American India Foundation (AIF), aimed at providing access to quality education opportunities for children residing in areas affected by migration in the 6 districts of Chhattisgarh. Ensuring an increased number of children from seasonal migration prone families to attend school regularly and Demonstrate grade appropriate results. The LAMP program is focuses on Kabirdham, Balodabazaar, Dhamtari, Mahasamund, Sarangarh and Shakti district of Chhattisgarh.

OUR CUMULATIVE IMPACT


1159 children at a risk due to seasonal migration empowered with access to quality education




Learning and Resource Centre (LRC) has a substantial result across the designated six districts of Chhattisgarh. The LRC is operational in 10 villages spread across six districts, serving as a crucial hub for educational enrichment. A total of 1387 Nos. of children from 3 to 8 Grade has been focused on foundational literacy and numeracy and also the grade appropriateness for grades 4 & 5.



The Learning Enrichment Program (LEP) is the core program of the LAMP intervention. This is deliver to provide basic foundational learning and bridge the learning gap for the dropout/ irregular children. 27 schools have been reached and 3896 Nos. of children identified in these schools for bridging the learning gaps of children from grade 3 to 5.




The project engages and worked in 45 Anganwadi Centers covering 1907 children for strengthening the Early Childhood Education (ECE) and 90 Anganwadi workers & helpers are trained in hand made TLM's.



576 SMC members from 36 schools are trained in formulation of school development plan, monitoring of Mid- Day- Meal, tracking of out of school children and awareness about Right to Education.

634 PRI & community members from 38 villages are trained on identifying and influencing families prone to migration and out of school children, access issues related to children, identifying potential SMC members and access to Government schemes for families affected with migration.



Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was successfully organized and signed between the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) and Samerth Charitable Trust, Chhattisgarh, outlining collaborative efforts for ongoing initiatives in six districts of Chhattisgarh and work order has been received from the department. The work is also initiated as per the order.
